Celebrate the sunny season by dipping your toes into the city's many outdoor concert series. Break up the workday monotony with downtown Seattle's Out to Lunch series (downtownseattle.com/summer)-short, free, noontime concerts in public plazas-including The Paperboys at Harbor Steps (8/8); The Dusty 45s at Harbor Steps (8/15); The Maldives at Occidental Square (8/22); and Leroy Bell at Harbor Steps (8/27). Or plan an enchanted, artful evening at the Olympic Sculpture Park's Summer in the Park series (seattleartmuseum.org/summer), featuring Industrial Revelation (8/14) and the The Dusty 45s (8/21). KEXP brings the best indie bands to the Concerts at the Mural series at Seattle Center (Fridays in August, 5:30 p.m. seattlecenter.com/concertsatthemural), such as Tacocat and Kithkin (8/1), Katie Kate (8/8), and Mark Pickerel and Star Anna (8/22). On the Eastside, Marymoor Park (marymoorconcerts.com) hosts big names Ray LaMontagne (8/13) and Beck (8/20), while Salish Lodge's Music on the Green series (salishlodge.com/musiconthegreen.php) features Seattle indie-folk bands The Horde and the Harem (8/7) and Kris Orlowski (8/14). And for a truly schmancy night with wine galore. check out Chateau Ste. Michelle's summer concert lineup (ste-michelle.com), including Gipsy Kings (8/22) and Peter Frampton (8/24).
